Agency service fee:

1.25 percent of estimated task order value; paid directly to DISA by the end user via a MIPR

Contract types supported:

Firm fixed price; Time and materials; Cost plus fixed fee; Cost plus award fee; Performance-based

Min/Max:

The government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the contractor obligated to furnish, supplies or services for orders under \$500 or over \$50 million (\$100M for multiple related orders).

Task order competition required:

Uses a fair opportunity process to compete unless for customer urgent need, unique/highly specialized requirements, in the interests of efficiency/logical follow-on, in order to satisfy a contractor’s minimum guarantee, or as the result of a statute/law.

Performance period:

Five-year base period (1 June 2008 – 31 May 2013); Five one-year option periods (1 June 2013 – 31 May 2018)
